- **3. Promoting Club** Ballynahinch & District Motor Club Ltd. (hereafter referred to as The Organisers) will promote a Clubmans Permit Multi Use Rally at Bishopscourt Racing Circuit on Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> July 2010.
- **4. Governing Rules** The meeting will be held under the General Regulations of the Motor Sports Association Ltd (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the F.I.A.), and these Supplementary Regulations.

#### 5. M.S.A. Permit Number: TBA

**6. Championships** 'This event is a counting round of the Pacenotes ANICC 2wd Challenge 2010 (Permit No 14/2010). Regulations and information for the Pacenotes Challenge can be downloaded from <a href="www.2wdrally.com">www.2wdrally.com</a> or from the Stage Rally section at <a href="www.anicc.org.uk">www.anicc.org.uk</a>. A Challenge representative will be in attendance at event documentation'

This event is also a round of the Ballynahinch & District Motor Club Championship.

**7. Eligible entrants** The meeting is open to all fully elected members of the above Club and who hold a valid MSA Competition Licence. All competitors must produce a valid Ballynahinch & District Motor Club Membership Card and a National 'B' Competition Licence at Documentation.

All competitors must produce a valid competition licence issued by the MSA or MSI and a club membership card and were applicable an entrants licence.

#### 9. The programme for the meeting will be:

#### 9.1. Scrutineering.

Scrutiny will take place at the Circuit on the morning of Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> July 2010. Individual times for Scrutiny will be advised in Final Instructions 1 which will be posted on our website <a href="www.ballynahinchmotorclub.com">www.ballynahinchmotorclub.com</a> on or before Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> July 2010. Competitors failing to attend scrutiny at the time stated in these instructions will be penalised as per SR28.22. Any competitor not signed on by 09.30hrs WILL be excluded and his place taken by a competitor from the Reserve Entry List, should one exist, or failing this he may be requested to take up a place at the end of the starting list. At scrutiny cars will be examined for compliance with tyre and vehicle safety regulations as well as for class eligibility. All vehicles must comply with MSA Technical Regulations J and R46-R48. A noise test will be carried out prior to vehicle scrutiny as per J 5.18; maximum permitted limit 98dBa(a), this will be strictly enforced.

- **9.2.** Competitors Briefing will be Bishopscourt Racing Circuit (outside rally headquarters) at 09:30hrs. All competitors must attend as you may learn something that could save your or someone else's life!
- **9.3. Start times** Cars will start at 30sec intervals. First car will leave no earlier than 10:00hrs on Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> July 2010.

**10. Special stages** The event will consist of eight special stages with a mileage not more than 26.8 miles. The entire route will be within the confines of Bishopscourt Racing Circuit. An approved sketch will define special stage routes. These stages will be timed to an accuracy of less than one minute in accorandance with R 2.7.2. The stage will take the form of 100% sealed surface. Safety notes will be permitted. R 25.9.

USE OF RED FLAG As per MSA regulations a RED FLAG will only be used if necessary to deploy the Doctor/Rescue vehicles during a special stage. This flag will be displayed at the 'yump' on rejoining the race circuit or at the stage merge. On display of this flag you <u>MUST STOP</u> <u>IMMEDIATELY!</u> A marshal will then direct you to the service area. Times for a special stage stopped by use of the red flag will be disregarded.

#### The use of tyre heating devices are prohibited.

- 11. Competition numbers <u>WIL</u> be supplied by the organisers. Space must be made available for the event sponsors stickers, which must be displayed. Cars not displaying event sponsors stickers will be excluded.
- 12. Classes The event will be divided into the following classes: -
- Class 1 Group N cars up to and including 2000cc. (see article 12 for definition)
- Class 2 Group N cars over 2000cc. (see article 15 for definition)
- Class 3 All cars up to and including 1400cc. 2-wheel drive only
- Class 4 All cars from 1401cc up to and including 1650cc, having not more than 2 valves per cylinder (8 valve). 2 Wheel drive only.
- Class 5 All cars from 1401cc up to and including 1650cc, having more than 2 valves per cylinder (16 valve). 2 wheel drive only.
- Class 6 All cars from 1651cc up to and including 2100cc having not more than 2 valves per cylinder (8 valve). 2 wheel drive only.
- Class 7 All cars from 1651cc up to and including 2100cc having more than 2 valves per cylinder (16 valve). 2 wheel drive only.
- Class 8 All cars from 2101cc up to and including 2400cc. 2 wheel drive only.

#### The onus is on the competitor to enter the correct class.

- **13.** Log book, Motor tax & MOT All cars must produce an MSA or MSI log book. All Northern Ireland and UK registered cars must also produce a valid MOT certificate if applicable. Tax discs are not required as the event is off the public road. Log books cannot be issued at the event and it is competitor's responsibility to obtain same prior to the event.
- 14 All cars must comply with the current MSA vehicle regulations (including the requirement for all vehicles to produce a logbook) appropriate to the individual event entered.

  14.1 Competitors are reminded of requirements under 2010 MSA Yearbook Competitors: Vehicles; Regulation J5.13.7 where all cars must be equipped with the facility to enable a fuel sample to be taken.
- **14.2** All cars must have Mud Flaps fitted behind each wheel. The mud flap material must be flexible with a minimum thickness of 4mm. The mud flap must extend to a minimum of 4cm either side of the tyre tread. The bottom of the mud flap must be no more than 8cm from the ground when the car is stopped with nobody on board.

- **14.3** All competitors must carry within their vehicle a self contained Spill Kit capable of effectively absorbing minor spillages of up to 1.5 litres of all vehicle fluids oils, fuels, coolants, battery acid. Used Spill Kits are to be disposed of in accordance with local or National guidelines.
- **14.4** Turbo engined cars, class determined by capacity x 1.7; Rotary engined cars, class determined by capacity x 1.7.
- 14.5 Vehicle Regulations for Classes 1 & 2. (Note: ALL competitors take note of Art. 5.14).
- **14.6** Cars eligible for Classes 1 & 2 are those, which are, or have at any time been, homologated in Group N as defined in FIA Appendix J, also any series production car that is, or has been, available for general sale in Northern Ireland.
- **14.7** The standard specification of any model shall be determined by FIA Homologation papers in the case of current and former Group N cars, and by manufacturers, or other, workshop manuals in the case of all other cars.
- **14.8** In all cases the degree of modification from standard shall be as provided for under FIA 2010 regulations for Group N.
- **14.9** The onus of proving eligibility for Classes 1 & 2 rests solely with the competitor.
- 15. Awards will be presented as follows: -

1<sup>st</sup> Overall Crew - Two Trophies 2<sup>nd</sup> Overall Crew - Two Trophies 3<sup>rd</sup> Overall Crew - Two Trophies

1<sup>st</sup> in Class - Two Trophies 2<sup>nd</sup> in Class - Two Trophies 3<sup>rd</sup> in Class - Two Trophies

Additional awards may be presented at the organiser's discretion.

#### 16. Maximum/Minimum Entry.

The maximum entry for the meeting is 80. The minimum is 35. The minimum entry for each class is 5. Should any of the minimum figures not be reached the organisers have the right to cancel the meeting D29 or amalgamate classes as required.

#### 17. Accepted entries

Entries will be accepted on a first come first served basis up to 70 at which time the club reserve the right to allocate the final ten places at their discretion.

#### 18. Priority places.

If more than 80 entries are received then R 14 will apply and a reserve list of up to 24 potential competitors may be assembled as per R 15

#### 20. Entry Fees.

Entry list opens. - On publication of these regulations.

Standard Entry list closes. - Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> June 2010

Standard entry fee. - £165.00 up to Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> June 2010 Late entry fee. - £180.00 up to Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> July 2010

**21. Refund Policy** Entries withdrawn in writing or by E-mail to the Secretary of the Meeting, before 29<sup>th</sup> June 2010, will be refunded in full less £20.00 to cover administration costs. Entries withdrawn before 6<sup>th</sup> July will be refunded less £40.00 to cover administration costs. Entry fees for entries withdrawn after this date will not be refunded. No written notification to Secretary of Event, no refund.

**22. Seeding** will be based on results filled in on the entry form. If you don't fill in the form we will presume you are a beginner. The order of starting will be at the organiser's discretion. Once the entry list has been published no discussion regarding it will be entered in to. Any competitor found falsifying their results will be reported to the MSA.

POSTAL ENTRIES ONLY WILL BE ACCEPTED All entries are to be made on the official entry form and must be fully completed and include all relevant fees.

All the closing dates listed above are the date of receipt and not date of posting. All cheques should be made payable to BADMC and crossed "A/C PAYEE". Entries received with cheques dated after date of receipt by the organisers will not be accepted. Entries not accompanied by the correct fee will not be accepted. Do not send cash in the post. Refusal of an entry will be notified in writing.

**25. Provisional Results** will be published as soon as possible after the event. Queries must be made with the Competitor Liaison Officer (CLO) up to and no later than 30 minutes after the posting of provisional results. Stage times will be posted on the official notice board during the event at regular intervals. Please note these times will be for information only.

All protests must be made through the CLO and must be in accordance with C 5.1 - 6.6. Competitors may apply to the Secretary of the Meeting for permission to remove their vehicle from final Parc Ferme before the declaration of final results on the understanding that they forfeit their right to defend any protest or irregularity regarding the eligibility of the crew in question. Competitors will be supplied with a Road Book/Time Cards at signing on or at the Event Documentation.

#### 26. Modified MSA Regulations

All other SSR's of the MSA apply as written except for the following which are modified: - Servicing may only be carried out in the specific area as indicated in the final instructions and Competitors Road Book. In the event of a tie, a competitor who has a greater number of faster times will be the winner, failing which the fastest time on the last stage and so on until a result can be obtained.

#### 27. Penalties

Jump Start - ONE MINUTE.

All penalties will be applied at the end of the event but the organisers will endeavour to inform the affected crew as soon as possible.

#### 27.1 Competitors are reminded of the following:

Named Judges of Fact will be appointed to observe facts in accordance with R 8.1 and named driving standards observers will be appointed to observe facts in accordance with R 8.1. These names will appear in Final Instructions.

- 27.2 The Damage Declaration form must be completed whether a finisher or not and must be received by the Secretary of the Meeting within 72 hours of the finish of the event.
- 27.3 Maximum Speed Limit in the Service area is 10 MPH
- 27.4 Should any car be found to be ineligible for the class entered on any challenge event, or if any competitor is excluded from a Challenge event for fraudulent or unsportsmanlike behaviour or bringing the sport into disrepute all points scored by both crew members to date shall be forfeited. In addition, any competitor bringing the sport into disrepute through the unauthorised use of private and/or Forest Service lands will result in their registration for this Challenge and points awarded (if any) being annulled. Furthermore, such competitors will be reported to the MSA and may be ineligible to register for any future Challenge.

#### 28. Special Stages

- 28.1. Achieving a time which is less than the minimum time stated in the Road Book MINIMUM TIME FOR STAGE.
- 28.2. Achieving a time which is greater than the maximum time stated in the Road Book MAXIMUM TIME FOR STAGE.
- 28.3. Achieving a time which is between 1 and 2 above ACTUAL TIME IN MINUTES AND SECONDS.
- 28.4. Failure to attempt a special stage MAXIMUM TIME FOR STAGE.
- 28.5. Failure to follow a specified route MAXIMUM TIME FOR STAGE.
- 28.6. Failure to start a special stage when instructed MAXIMUM TIME FOR STAGE.
- 28.7. Any unauthorised person found trespassing on any stage EXCLUSION.
- 28.8. Reporting at a Control after due time 10 SECONDS PER MINUTE.
- 28.9. Reporting at a Control before due time 20 SECONDS PER MINUTE.
- 28.10. Not reporting at a Control EXCLUSION.
- 28.11. Wrong approach or departure at a Control EXCLUSION.
- 28.12. Servicing in an area declared as a non-service area EXCLUSION.
- 28.13. Reporting at a Control, 5 or more minutes after due time EXCLUSION.
- 28.14. Absence of a recorded time at a Control EXCLUSION.
- 28.15. Failure by a crewmember to fasten their Crash Helmets Properly EXCLUSION.
- 28.16. Failure to produce or surrender any Time Cards on request EXCLUSION.
- 28.17. Misconduct by any member of a service crew or car EXCLUSION.
- 28.18. Making a false start on a stage ONE MINUTE PENALTY.

- 28.19. Breach of Regulation R5.4,R15.1.2,R15.1.4 or R25.= EXCLUSION.
- 28.20. Breach of statutory requirement concerning the driving of a motor vehicle EXCLUSION
- 28.21. Receiving assistance contrary to R38.1.1 R39.3.3 EXCLUSION.
- 28.22. Failure to report at a specified day and time for scrutiny EXCLUSION.
- 28.23. First violation of Driving standards and/or noise infringement 10 MINUTE TIME PENALTY.
- 28.24. Second violation of Driving standards and/or noise infringement EXCLUSION
- 28.25. Reported breach of Road Traffic Laws EXCLUSION.

A copy of the Supplementary and any other relevant regulations will be posted on the Official Notice Board.

- **29. Special Stage Time Cards** one or more special stage time cards with appropriate spaces for recording start and finish times will be issued to the competitor. Competitors must ensure that their competion number is entered on each card before it is handed to an event official. Failure to do so may result in a competitor being classified as a non-finisher.
- **30. Stage Starts** will be done by means of a flag or other type of signal. After the signal the competitor will accelerate into the stage. All special stages have a flying finish. After crossing the finishing line the competitor will stop at the timekeepers control and have his or her time recorded. The onus is on the competitor to ensure that the official marks the time card clearly and correctly.
- **31.** Scrutiny and Signing on Before being issued with the necessary documents to enable you to start the rally the following points should be noted.

That both driver and navigator are in possession of a Rally National B Stage MSA or equivalent MSI licence.

That a red reflective triangle and MSA Approved SOS/OK Board is carried in the competing car. Competitors are reminded that MSA Vehicle Technical Requirements for a special stage rally are mandatory.

Both crew members must provide a mobile phone number on which they can be contacted during the rally weekend. This will only be used by the organisers for information and accountability purposes.

- **32. Reconnaissance/Safety notes** Competitors will only be permitted to examine the stages between 07.00hrs and 09.30hrs on Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> July 2010 on foot or bicycle. NO motorised forms of transport permitted. Safety Notes will be permitted. Any competitor who has been authorised by the Clerk of Course to work on a special stage will be exempt from exclusion.
- **33. Service/Service Area** The service area will be located in the paddock area of Bishopscourt Racing Circuit. Competitors will only be allowed one service vehicle per competing car. These vehicles will be identified by service plates which will be supplied by the organisers. All service vehicles must be in service park no later than 09.00hrs on the morning of the event. All competing cars must have a ground sheet for use in service park. If you do not adhere to this, you will not be allowed to service. The speed limit while in the service park is 10 MPH. Any competitors or member of a service crew belonging to a competitor, who is deemed to be in excess of the speed limit, or deemed to have committed an act of careless driving, or damages the surface or surroundings of the service area will be excluded. Mopeds or any motorised scooters etc will not be allowed in the service park.

Any competitors wishing to bring motorhomes/hospitiality units etc into the service area must inform the Secretary of the Meeting. These vehicles will not be admitted without prior consultation with the Secretary of the Meeting before 3<sup>rd</sup> July 2010. NO PERSON WILL BE PERMITTED TO USE ANY FORM OF MOTORISED OR PEDAL TRANSPORT IN OR AROUND THE SERVICE AREA AFTER 09.00HRS THIS PARTICULARY APPLIES TO CHILDREN. If any person ignoring this instruction is connected to a competitor he/she will BE EXCLUDED. THIS IS FOR EVERYBODYS SAFETY AND WILL BE ENFORCED.

- **34. Interpretation of regulations** It is not the duty of any marshal to interpret regulations or any written instructions to a competitor or to explain the meaning and/or effect there of. It is the responsibility of the competitor to read and understand the regulations and other written instructions. When an entry has been received by the organisers it is understood that all competitors have read and understood these supplementary regulations.
- **35. Abuse of Officials** Any competitor, service crew who directly or indirectly abuses an official of this event either verbally or by any other means will be excluded and reported to the MSA.
- **36.** All reference numbers relate to the 2010 MSA Competitors Year Book.
- **37. Organisers liability** The Organisers decline liability in any accident caused by or to competitors, drivers and competing cars during the whole of the event. The Organisers also decline any liability for breach of the laws and regulations of Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland covered by the itinerary. Competitors shall be held responsible for any accident or breach of laws in which they may be involved and shall declare to the organiser's particulars of any incident from which liability may arise and shall have no claim against the Organisers arising out of any action of the Organisers, their servants or officials, during the course of the rally.
- **38. Sponsor advertising** Competitors must provide a space of 12" x 6" on each side of the two front doors of the competiting car for additional sponsor advertising.
- **39. NOISE RESTRICTIONS** Due to Planning Permission at Bishopscourt Racing Circuit, the owners and management of the circuit require us the organisers to keep noise levels to an absolute minimum up until 09.00hrs. Therefore all unloading of competeting cars will take place in the service area, with the minimum amount of noise. When competeting cars have been unloaded from trailers, service vehicles will be required to take trailers to the trailer park which will be indicated by an official. Any excessive noise from competition vehicles, service vehicles or otherwise before 09.00hrs will be a breach of planning regulations and could seriously jeopardise this excellent venue for further use for everybody. We the organisers would ask that all competitors and service crews take this into consideration.
